EKU Referee Certification Programme

16 January 2024

With the aim of improving the quality and integrity of Kabaddi matches in England and the UK, England Kabaddi Union (EKU) will be organising a referee certification programme. Individuals who complete this programme will be able to referee at Kabaddi matches as certified referees endorsed by the EKU.

Why you should consider becoming an EKU certified referee

- Opportunity to referee at Kabaddi events across the UK;
- Ability to contribute to the promotion and growth of Kabaddi across the UK;
- Gain experience in a challenging sporting environment.

Exam format

The programme will consist of two stages:

• Stage 1: Theory exam

- o Candidates must pass a theory exam in order to start Stage 2.
- The theory exam will be accompanied by a 1 hour Referee training module.
- The curriculum for the test will be the latest version of the EKU Official Kabaddi Rules: www.englandkabaddi.com/rules

Stage 2: Practical experience

- Candidates who have passed their theory exam must complete 10 hours of refereeing under the supervision of certified EKU Referees.
- Upon completing 10 hours of refereeing as specified above, certified candidates will receive their Referee certification.

When is the next exam?

- The next theory exam will be held on 27 January 2024 at 4 5 pm.
- The address for the venue is as follows: Avanti House Secondary School Wemborough Rd, Stanmore HA7 2EQ

Eligibility criteria

- Candidates must be at least 18 years old.
- Candidates must have at least 2 years of Kabaddi playing experience in the UK.

Notes

- A Referee certification is valid for **3 years**.
- An annual fee of £10 per year shall be payable in order for the certification to remain valid. This fee is subject to change on an annual basis.
- EKU certified referees shall **not** referee matches / tournaments outside the EKU certification program and they must qualify the course. If they do referee outside the EKU certification program, the EKU may hold them **ineligible** to represent England as part of the EKU team and their referee certification may be revoked.

EKU reserves the right to conduct regular performance reviews for certified referees. EKU reserves the right to revoke a candidate's participation and/or qualification for breach of any of EKU's policies or any applicable laws, as the case may be. Visit www.englandkabaddi.com/legal.
